

# PARAMED TATTOO

## Master Educational Terms, Practitioner Conditions, Policies & Legal Agreements

### IMPORTANT

This master document is drafted as a high-protection commercial template for Paramed Tattoo. It should be reviewed by a New Zealand lawyer before final execution, publication, or reliance for a specific transaction.

This document is intended for educational programme, practitioner standards, data, intellectual property, refund, privacy, accreditation, media, platform and practical training governance.

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# 1. Document Status and Use

1.1 This document is a master policy and contractual framework intended to govern the relationship between Paramed Tattoo and each Participant who applies for, purchases, accesses, enrolls in, attends, uses, or participates in any Programme, training, support system, educational platform, practitioner infrastructure, practical activity, digital system, accreditation process, or related service.

1.2 This document is designed to be used in conjunction with website legal pages, application forms, enrolment forms, student acceptance checkboxes, payment terms, practical training waivers, model consent forms, practitioner standards, media release forms, privacy notices, and any written enrolment agreement issued by Paramed Tattoo.

1.3 Where any short-form website policy conflicts with this Master Document, this Master Document prevails to the maximum extent permitted by law, unless a later written agreement signed by Paramed Tattoo expressly states otherwise.

1.4 This document should be made available before enrolment, payment, portal access, practical training, model participation, or any certification or practitioner recognition process.

1.5 Paramed Tattoo may update this document from time to time for operational, legal, compliance, educational, technological, intellectual property, accreditation, or health and safety reasons.

## 2. Definitions and Interpretation

### 2.1 Definitions

**Accreditation:** any internal recognition, certificate, directory listing, affiliated practitioner status, graduate status, practitioner recognition, approved provider status, badge, listing, or designation issued by Paramed Tattoo.

**Business Day:** any day other than a Saturday, Sunday, public holiday in Auckland, New Zealand, or any day on which banks are generally closed in Auckland.

**Client:** any person receiving, enquiring about, consenting to, modelling for, or participating in a treatment, demonstration, consultation, assessment, or practical training environment.

**Confidential Information:** all non-public, proprietary, commercial, operational, strategic, educational, technical, procedural, observational, student, practitioner, client, system, methodology, pricing, curriculum, platform, template, AI, database, or intellectual property information belonging to or used by Paramed Tattoo.

**Educational Materials:** all written, visual, oral, digital, practical, video, template, workflow, protocol, database, AI, demonstration, system, dashboard, assessment, workbook, presentation, recording, worksheet, form, framework, and supporting educational content made available by Paramed Tattoo.

**Intellectual Property:** all present and future intellectual property rights, including copyright, trade marks, designs, trade secrets, confidential information, know-how, educational structures, operational frameworks, systems, databases, templates, AI systems, workflows, methodologies, curriculum architecture, logos, names, graphics, written material, videos, and associated proprietary material.

**Paramed Tattoo:** Paramed Tattoo and, where the context permits, its owner, directors, employees, contractors, educators, assistants, licensors, suppliers, assigns, successors, platforms, systems, and authorised representatives.

**Participant:** any applicant, student, enrolled student, practitioner, contractor, model, observer, client, collaborator, affiliate, educator, website user, platform user, or person accessing any Programme, system, material, service, event, practical training activity, or platform.

**Programme:** any Paramed Tattoo course, training, mentorship, workshop, practical intensive, online module, portal, AI system, practitioner system, assessment system, database, operational system, support programme, accreditation process, educational material, community, consultation, or associated educational infrastructure.

**Restricted Use:** any unauthorised use, reproduction, distribution, uploading, disclosure, reverse engineering, scraping, copying, teaching, sublicensing, AI training, derivative creation, competitor replication, or commercial exploitation of Programme material, systems, or infrastructure.

**Systems:** all educational, operational, clinical-observation, AI-assisted, practitioner, database, dashboard, portal, workflow, assessment, case review, support, and accreditation systems used or supplied by Paramed Tattoo.

### 2.2 Interpretation

- Headings are for convenience only and do not affect interpretation.
- References to legislation include any amendment, replacement, re-enactment, regulation, code, notice, or subordinate instrument.
- The singular includes the plural and the plural includes the singular.

- A reference to a person includes a natural person, company, partnership, trust, incorporated society, association, agency, or other legal entity.
- The words "including", "includes" and "in particular" are illustrative and do not limit the preceding words.
- An obligation not to do something includes an obligation not to assist, permit, procure, encourage, or allow that thing to be done.

## 3. Master Terms and Conditions

### 3.1 Binding Terms

By applying for, purchasing, enrolling in, accessing, attending, downloading, using, or participating in any Programme, Participant acknowledges and agrees to be bound by this Master Document, all policies and schedules incorporated into it, and any additional written conditions issued by Paramed Tattoo.

Electronic acceptance, form submission, payment, portal access, download of Educational Materials, attendance, participation, or continued use of any Programme constitutes acceptance of these Terms.

### 3.2 Entire Agreement and Non-Reliance

This Master Document, together with any written enrolment confirmation, invoice, application acceptance, and applicable schedule, constitutes the entire agreement between Paramed Tattoo and the Participant in relation to the Programme and supersedes all previous representations, understandings, negotiations, discussions, social media statements, marketing material, informal messages, oral statements, projections, or collateral communications.

Participant acknowledges that they have not relied on any representation, warranty, income statement, business outcome projection, social media statement, marketing claim, verbal assurance, treatment outcome representation, or statement not expressly set out in writing in this Master Document or a signed written agreement issued by Paramed Tattoo.

### 3.3 Governing Law and Jurisdiction

These Terms are governed by the laws of New Zealand. Participant submits to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of New Zealand in relation to any dispute, claim, proceeding, or matter arising out of or in connection with these Terms, the Programme, or any Paramed Tattoo system or service.

Paramed Tattoo may seek urgent injunctive relief or equitable remedies in any court of competent jurisdiction where necessary to protect Intellectual Property, Confidential Information, Systems, commercial goodwill, safety, or operational integrity.

### 3.4 Amendment and Operational Change

Paramed Tattoo may amend these Terms, Programme structures, delivery methods, schedules, policies, educational content, platforms, system access, support structures, accreditation criteria, pricing, practical training requirements, and operational standards from time to time for legal, safety, educational, compliance, commercial, technological, or operational reasons.

Updated Terms are effective upon publication, issue to Participants, portal update, or continued participation after notice. Continued participation after changes are made constitutes acceptance of the amended Terms.

### 3.5 Severability, Waiver and Survival

If any clause is found invalid, unlawful, void, or unenforceable, it will be severed to the minimum extent necessary and the remaining clauses will continue in full force.

Failure or delay by Paramed Tattoo to exercise any right, power, discretion, or remedy does not constitute waiver. Any waiver must be in writing and signed by Paramed Tattoo.

Clauses relating to fees, payment recovery, refunds, Intellectual Property, confidentiality, non-reliance, limitation of liability, indemnity, data rights, media rights, brand usage, dispute resolution, jurisdiction, and enforcement survive completion, withdrawal, termination, expiry, revocation, or cessation of participation.

## 4. Educational Status and Regulatory Positioning

Paramed Tattoo is a private educational provider within restorative aesthetics, skin-focused restorative treatment education, paramedical tattooing education, practitioner development systems, observational training infrastructure, and associated operational frameworks.

Nothing within any Programme, certification, accreditation, training, Educational Material, social media content, website content, communication, AI output, practitioner system, mentorship, or platform constitutes or shall be construed as:

- a medical qualification, medical licence, regulated healthcare qualification, surgical qualification, or statutory registration;

- NZQA accreditation unless expressly stated in writing;
- authorisation to undertake restricted medical activities or any activity prohibited by law;
- a guarantee of practitioner competency, treatment outcome, income, employment, clientele, or business success;
- legal, medical, financial, insurance, taxation, employment, regulatory, or professional advice.

Participant remains solely responsible for determining whether any service, treatment, advertising claim, business operation, or practitioner activity is lawful in the jurisdiction in which Participant operates.

Participant must not represent or imply that Programme participation makes them medically qualified, clinically licensed, government accredited, registered with any healthcare authority, or operating under Paramed Tattoo supervision after completion unless expressly authorised in writing.

## 5. Applications, Acceptance, Enrolment and Completion

### 5.1 Application and Selection

Submission of an application or expression of interest does not guarantee acceptance, enrolment, certification, accreditation, or placement. Paramed Tattoo may accept or decline any applicant in its sole discretion.

Selection may be based on suitability, communication, professionalism, hygiene awareness, commitment, capacity, intake limitations, operational requirements, safety considerations, and alignment with Programme standards.

### 5.2 Enrolment Conditions

Enrolment may be conditional upon completion of application forms, acceptance of Terms, payment, provision of accurate information, supply of required identification or contact information, and any other requirement reasonably imposed by Paramed Tattoo.

Paramed Tattoo may cancel, suspend, defer, or refuse enrolment where information is inaccurate, incomplete, misleading, or where Participant is considered unsuitable for the Programme.

### 5.3 Completion Timeframes

Programme completion timeframes, access periods, submission deadlines, assessment dates, practical training dates, and support availability will be communicated for each intake or Programme where applicable. Unless otherwise stated in writing, online access, mentorship access, platform access, and submission windows may be time-limited.

Extensions are discretionary and must be approved in writing. Failure to complete required submissions, attendance, practical requirements, hygiene standards, payment obligations, or competency standards within the prescribed period may result in incomplete status, withheld certification, suspended access, or removal from the Programme.

### 5.4 Certification Not Guaranteed

Certification, completion status, Accreditation, support access, directory listing, or recognition is not automatic and may be withheld, delayed, restricted, suspended, or refused where Paramed Tattoo determines that competency, hygiene, conduct, payment, attendance, documentation, or professional standards have not been satisfied.

## 6. Fees, Payment Default and Refund Policy

### 6.1 Fees and Non-Refundable Components

All deposits, enrolment fees, tuition fees, instalments, access fees, mentorship fees, practical training fees, workshop fees, digital access fees, licensing fees, and associated payments are non-refundable except where required by applicable law.

Deposits secure limited placement, operational allocation, preparation, scheduling, educator time, administrative work, and access planning. Change of mind, personal circumstances, failure to attend, non-completion, business circumstances, relocation, scheduling conflicts, or unmet expectations do not entitle Participant to a refund.

### 6.2 Digital Access and Intellectual Property Exposure

Once Participant has received access to portals, Educational Materials, videos, templates, workbooks, recordings, systems, databases, AI systems, practitioner infrastructure, or other proprietary Programme materials, refund eligibility may be further limited due to irreversible exposure to Intellectual Property and confidential educational infrastructure.

## 6.3 Payment Plans and Default

Where a payment plan is approved, Participant remains liable for all instalments according to the agreed schedule. Failure to pay any instalment by the due date may result in immediate suspension of access, withholding of certification, denial of practical training participation, revocation of support access, cancellation of enrolment, and recovery action.

Paramed Tattoo may recover outstanding amounts, administrative recovery costs, debt collection fees, legal costs, chargeback costs, and enforcement costs to the maximum extent permitted by law.

## 6.4 Consumer Law

Nothing in this document excludes, restricts, or modifies any rights or remedies that cannot lawfully be excluded under applicable New Zealand legislation, including the Consumer Guarantees Act 1993 and Fair Trading Act 1986 where applicable.

Where services are acquired for business, trade, commercial, professional, contractor, educational, or practitioner-development purposes, Participant agrees that statutory protections may be limited or contracted out of to the maximum extent permitted by law.

# 7. Intellectual Property, Confidentiality and Systems Protection

## 7.1 Ownership

All Intellectual Property, Educational Materials, Systems, branding, names, logos, course structures, workflows, templates, dashboards, databases, AI systems, practitioner infrastructure, treatment frameworks, language systems, curriculum architecture, videos, graphics, forms, assessments, submission frameworks, case review systems, and operational methodologies are and remain the exclusive property of Paramed Tattoo or its licensors.

## 7.2 Limited Licence

Participant receives a limited, revocable, non-exclusive, non-transferable licence to access Educational Materials solely for their personal authorised participation in the Programme. No ownership interest, sublicensing right, teaching right, commercial exploitation right, replication right, or ongoing access right is granted.

## 7.3 Prohibited Uses

Participant must not, without prior written consent from Paramed Tattoo:

- copy, reproduce, distribute, upload, teach, resell, licence, sublicense, publish, record, screenshot for redistribution, or commercially exploit Educational Materials;
- share account credentials, portal access, systems, templates, databases, workbooks, or internal frameworks;
- reverse engineer, scrape, extract, map, clone, deconstruct, or reproduce Programme architecture;
- create a competing course, workshop, practitioner system, AI system, database, accreditation model, or educational product substantially derived from Paramed Tattoo material;
- train, fine-tune, prompt-engineer, embed, upload, or process Programme material through generative AI, large language models, machine learning systems, dataset creation systems, automated extraction tools, or synthetic training environments;
- use Programme material to create derivative works, summaries, prompts, operational replicas, templates, scripts, course modules, or automated systems for commercial use.

## 7.4 Confidentiality

Participant must keep Confidential Information strictly confidential and must not disclose, publish, discuss publicly, transfer, copy, misuse, or permit access to Confidential Information except as expressly authorised by Paramed Tattoo.

Confidentiality obligations continue indefinitely unless and until the relevant information enters the public domain lawfully through no breach by Participant.

## 7.5 Enforcement

Participant acknowledges that breach of this section may cause irreparable harm for which damages alone may be inadequate. Paramed Tattoo may seek urgent injunctive relief, equitable remedies, account of profits, damages, legal costs, and any other remedies available at law or equity.

## 8. Privacy, Data, AI and Observational Information

### 8.1 Collection and Use

Paramed Tattoo may collect, store, process, analyse, retain, archive, and use personal, educational, operational, assessment, payment, communication, platform, observational, and treatment-related information for Programme administration, education, safety, compliance, assessment, accreditation, support, dispute resolution, legal compliance, internal operations, AI-assisted systems, and business management.

### 8.2 Privacy Act

Where applicable, Paramed Tattoo will handle personal information in accordance with the Privacy Act 2020 and applicable privacy principles. Participant may request access to or correction of their personal information, subject to verification of identity and lawful retention requirements.

### 8.3 Third Party and Overseas Systems

Participant acknowledges that Paramed Tattoo may use cloud-hosted software, CRM systems, learning platforms, payment processors, analytics tools, AI systems, video platforms, email systems, booking systems, and operational providers that may store or process information in New Zealand or overseas.

### 8.4 Anonymised Observational Data

Paramed Tattoo may retain and use anonymised or de-identified treatment observations, healing information, practitioner submissions, procedural variables, educational analytics, platform interactions, assessment outcomes, and case information for educational refinement, practitioner development, quality assurance, AI-assisted troubleshooting, system improvement, research and development, and future Programme infrastructure.

Anonymised educational and observational data may be retained indefinitely. Personally identifiable information will not intentionally be publicly disclosed without consent unless required by law.

### 8.5 AI System Outputs

AI-assisted systems, digital troubleshooting tools, or automated support outputs are educational and operational aids only. They must not be treated as medical, legal, regulatory, financial, or definitive treatment advice. Participant remains responsible for all treatment decisions, professional judgement, client suitability, and lawful operation.

## 9. Practitioner Standards and Accreditation

### 9.1 Conditional and Revocable Status

Any Accreditation, practitioner recognition, certificate, directory listing, affiliated status, support access, graduate status, or badge is internal, conditional, revocable, non-transferable, discretionary, and subject to ongoing compliance. It is not statutory licensing, medical registration, employment, partnership, agency authority, franchise rights, or a guarantee of business success.

### 9.2 Ongoing Requirements

Paramed Tattoo may require practitioners to comply with ongoing requirements, including hygiene standards, treatment documentation, case submissions, continuing education, updated assessments, peer review, AI-system usage rules, client consent standards, advertising standards, brand standards, and operational conduct requirements.

### 9.3 Review, Suspension and Revocation

Paramed Tattoo may audit, review, suspend, restrict, or revoke Accreditation or affiliated status where standards are not maintained, conduct is unsafe, information is misleading, policies are breached, Intellectual Property is misused, payments remain outstanding, or Paramed Tattoo considers continued recognition inappropriate.

### 9.4 Appeals or Review

Paramed Tattoo may, but is not obliged to, offer an internal review process for suspension, refusal, or revocation decisions. Any review process may require written submissions, evidence, updated case work, retraining, or further assessment.

## 10. Health and Safety, Practical Training and Model Participation

### 10.1 Health and Safety Duties

Paramed Tattoo and Participants must take health and safety seriously. Participants must follow all reasonable health, safety, hygiene, infection control, sharps, PPE, workstation, consent, and practical training directions issued by Paramed Tattoo.

Participant acknowledges that practical training and restorative treatment work may involve inherent risks, including infection, allergic reaction, pigment unpredictability, inflammation, delayed healing, dissatisfaction, emotional distress, scarring response, biological variability, and procedural risk.

### 10.2 Participant Responsibility

Participant remains responsible for their conduct, hygiene, treatment decisions, client suitability assessment, local compliance, informed consent, infection prevention, sharps handling, and safe operation. Educational supervision does not transfer legal responsibility for Participant conduct or treatment outcomes.

### 10.3 Practical Exclusion

Paramed Tattoo may refuse, suspend, remove, or restrict Participant from practical training, live model work, demonstrations, treatment environments, or assessments where safety, conduct, competence, hygiene, legal, emotional, behavioural, or operational concerns arise.

### 10.4 Live Models and Clients

Live models and clients must complete all required consent and suitability documentation before participation. No treatment should proceed where informed consent, age eligibility, suitability, hygiene, or legal compliance is unclear.

## 11. Brand Representation, Advertising and Public Conduct

### 11.1 Permitted Representation

Participant must accurately represent their relationship with Paramed Tattoo. Participant must not state or imply that they are an employee, partner, agent, franchisee, official representative, master trainer, medical provider, or exclusive provider unless expressly authorised in writing.

### 11.2 Prohibited Claims

Participant must not make misleading, deceptive, exaggerated, unsubstantiated, or unlawful claims regarding treatment outcomes, income, accreditation, certification, clinical status, medical authority, client results, affiliation, or Programme scope.

### 11.3 Brand Use

Use of Paramed Tattoo names, logos, marks, badges, certificates, images, templates, screenshots, training materials, or affiliation language must comply with Paramed Tattoo written brand standards and may be withdrawn at any time.

### 11.4 Public Conduct

Participant must not knowingly publish false or misleading statements, disclose Confidential Information, impersonate Paramed Tattoo, intentionally interfere with commercial relationships, misuse branding, or engage in malicious conduct reasonably likely to damage Paramed Tattoo commercial goodwill. This clause does not prevent lawful complaints, protected disclosures, or legally required reporting.

## 12. Website, Platform and Digital Access Terms

Access to portals, dashboards, videos, AI systems, databases, communities, messaging systems, forms, templates, and digital resources is provided on a revocable, non-transferable access basis only.

Paramed Tattoo does not warrant that digital systems will be uninterrupted, error-free, permanently available, compatible with all devices, immune from cyber risk, or continuously maintained in their current form.

Paramed Tattoo may modify, replace, suspend, migrate, archive, discontinue, or restrict digital systems at any time for operational, legal, educational, security, or commercial reasons.

## 13. Independent Contractor Status

Nothing in these Terms creates employment, partnership, agency, joint venture, franchise, fiduciary duties, guaranteed referrals, territorial exclusivity, or guaranteed business opportunities.

Participant is solely responsible for tax, ACC, GST, insurance, clinic compliance, local authority requirements, employment obligations, contractor obligations, client relationships, advertising, and independent business operations.

## 14. Limitation of Liability and Indemnity

To the maximum extent permitted by law, Paramed Tattoo is not liable for indirect, consequential, special, exemplary, incidental, or economic loss, loss of profit, loss of income, loss of opportunity, business interruption, client disputes, practitioner conduct, treatment dissatisfaction, regulatory non-compliance, or misuse of Educational Materials or Systems.

Participant indemnifies Paramed Tattoo against all claims, losses, proceedings, liabilities, damages, penalties, costs, legal expenses, and demands arising directly or indirectly from Participant conduct, independent operation, treatment activity, advertising activity, breach of these Terms, regulatory breach, negligence, IP misuse, confidentiality breach, or third-party claims arising from Participant activity.

## 15. Disputes, Complaints and Enforcement

### 15.1 Complaints

Any complaint should be submitted in writing to Paramed Tattoo with sufficient detail to allow review. Paramed Tattoo may request further information, pause access, investigate internally, and issue a written response or operational decision.

### 15.2 Disciplinary Process

Paramed Tattoo may investigate suspected breaches, suspend access pending investigation, require written explanation, request evidence, require remedial action, issue warnings, impose restrictions, revoke Accreditation, terminate participation, or commence enforcement action.

### 15.3 Enforcement Costs

Participant is liable for Paramed Tattoo reasonable enforcement costs, recovery costs, legal costs, collection costs, and expenses incurred in enforcing these Terms, protecting Intellectual Property, recovering unpaid amounts, or addressing breach, to the maximum extent permitted by law.

## Schedule A - Practitioner Standards Framework

A.1 Practitioners must maintain standards of hygiene, infection prevention, documentation, client suitability screening, informed consent, advertising compliance, professional conduct, operational safety, treatment ethics, aftercare communication, lawful operation, and continuing education where required.

A.2 Failure to maintain standards may result in retraining requirements, temporary suspension, review, removal from affiliated systems, revocation of practitioner recognition, or termination of affiliation.

## Schedule B - Educational Access and Digital System Conditions

B.1 Educational access may include online modules, recorded videos, AI-assisted systems, databases, dashboards, submission systems, templates, workbooks, communities, forms, and support systems.

B.2 Access is revocable, may be time-limited, is not transferable, and may be suspended, modified, or discontinued where required.

## Schedule C - Practical Training Conditions

C.1 Practical training participation may require signed consent forms, PPE, workstation compliance, hygiene compliance, educator approval, competency readiness, model suitability, and lawful operational conduct.

C.2 Participant may be removed from practical training where Paramed Tattoo identifies safety, conduct, hygiene, emotional, legal, or competency concerns.

## Schedule D - Accreditation, Directory and Affiliation Conditions

D.1 Accreditation remains internal, discretionary, conditional, non-transferable, revocable, and subject to ongoing compliance. It does not create employment, partnership, medical licensing, or statutory authority.

D.2 Paramed Tattoo may require annual review, continuing education, updated case submissions, compliance checks, brand standards compliance, and evidence of safe practice.

## Schedule E - Media, Image and Educational Content Consent

E.1 Where consent is given, Paramed Tattoo may use treatment imagery, anonymised case material, workshop footage, training content, demonstrations, healed results, and associated media for education, internal systems, practitioner development, marketing, archival, and promotional purposes.

E.2 Consent may be restricted by written agreement. Personally identifiable information will not intentionally be publicly disclosed without consent unless required by law.

## Schedule F - Refund Policy

F.1 Payments are generally non-refundable due to limited placement capacity, digital access, operational allocation, educator time, and exposure to Intellectual Property, except where required by law.

F.2 No refund is provided for change of mind, non-attendance, failure to participate, failure to complete, scheduling conflict, business circumstances, unmet expectations, or removal for breach.

F.3 Any discretionary exception must be confirmed in writing and does not create precedent.

## Schedule G - Privacy Notice Summary

G.1 Paramed Tattoo may collect and use information for Programme delivery, communication, safety, payment, assessment, compliance, practitioner development, accreditation, system improvement, legal compliance, AI-assisted systems, and operational management.

G.2 Requests for access or correction may be submitted to [indi@paramedtattoos.com](mailto:indi@paramedtattoos.com). Identity verification may be required.

## Schedule H - Branding and Representation Policy

H.1 Participant must not use Paramed Tattoo branding, marks, badges, certification language, logos, screenshots, materials, or affiliation statements except as authorised.

H.2 Paramed Tattoo may require correction or removal of misleading, inaccurate, unlawful, low-standard, unsafe, or brand-damaging representations.

## Schedule I - AI and Systems Usage Policy

I.1 Participant must not upload Programme material into generative AI, LLM, automated learning, dataset, prompt library, model training, embedding, synthetic generation, or extraction systems.

I.2 Participant must not create derivative AI systems, automated tools, training bots, educational clones, or competitor systems derived from Programme material.

## Schedule J - Student Acknowledgement and Acceptance

By signing or electronically accepting these Terms, Participant confirms that they:

- have read and understood this Master Document;
- understand that the Programme is educational and does not confer medical licensing or statutory healthcare registration;
- understand that certification and accreditation are not guaranteed;
- understand that income, clients, business success, treatment outcomes, and employment are not guaranteed;
- agree to comply with intellectual property, confidentiality, data, privacy, health and safety, branding, and practitioner standards requirements;
- understand that Programme material must not be copied, shared, taught, uploaded, reverse engineered, used to train AI systems, or commercially reproduced;
